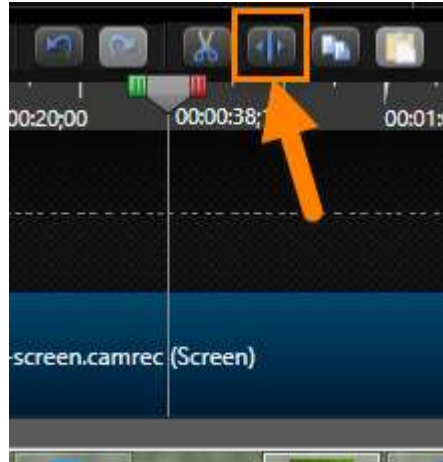


In-Depth Editing Technique Step by Step

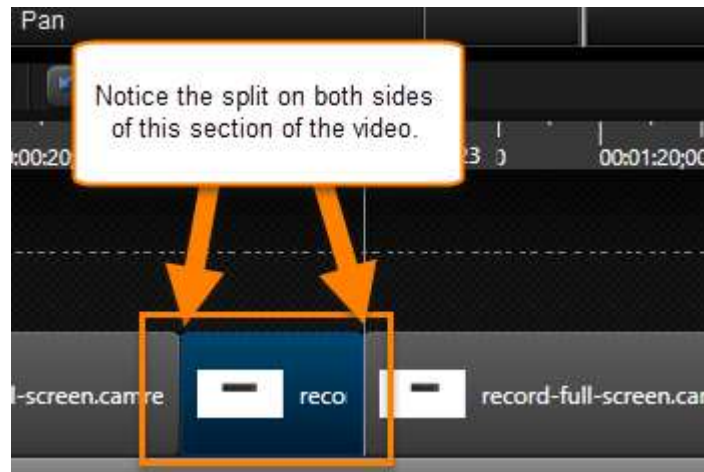
Splitting Technique:

This technique allows you to isolate parts of your video or audio track in order to make edits or delete part of your video or audio.

1. To make a split, select the track you wish to create a split. Place the play head where you wish to make the split and click on the Split icon above the timeline.



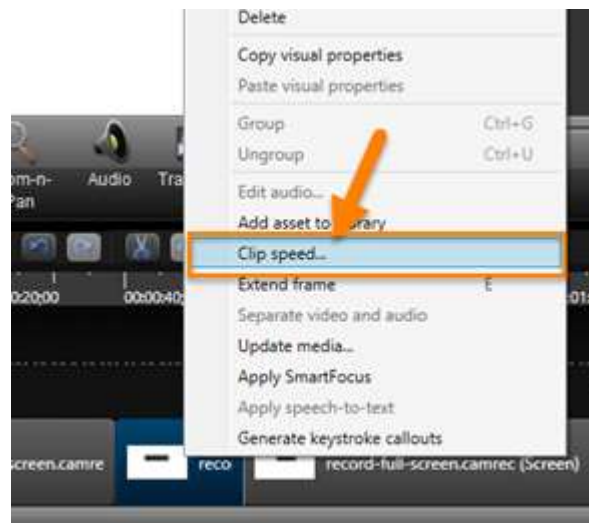
2. After you click on the Split Icon, you will end up with two distinct pieces of your video. This allows you to isolate sections of your video or audio for edits such as adjusting clip speed or making only part of the audio track louder or softer.



Clip Speed Technique:

This technique allows you to speed up or slow down parts of the video. This is used, for example, if you are demonstrating downloading software. You can speed up this part of the video. NOTE – It is best to only speed up or slow down specific parts of your video. You would use the Split technique to isolate these part of your video.

1. To increase or decrease the speed of the video, use the split technique to isolate the portion of the video. Make sure that portion of the video is selected.
2. Right click on the selected portion of the video and select Clip Speed.



3. In the click speed dialog box, adjust the speed by using the up or down arrows. Click Ok when done.



Ripple Technique:

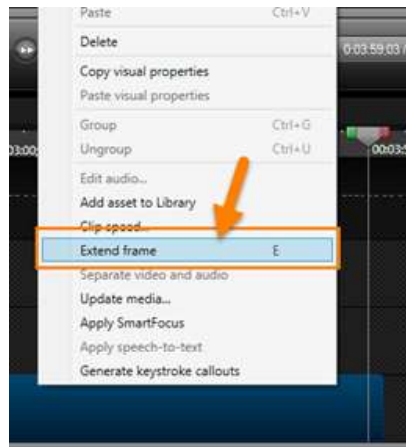
This technique allows you to move more than one track at a time so they are moved to the same place on the play head. NOTE – Ripple moves only unlocked tracks.

1. Hold the Shift Key down while simultaneously moving the play head. All tracks will move together.

Extend Frame Technique:

This technique allows you to extend a frame a number of seconds. This is useful if you did not find that you did not leave enough time in your recording. It will duplicate a frame that is selected.

1. Select the clip. Place the play head at the appropriate frame. Right click and choose Extend Frame.



2. A copy of the last frame was copied to the end of the clip. The default is 1 second. However, you can increase the duration by clicking the up or down arrows, manually entering the number of sections, or dragging out the extended clip. Click OK.
